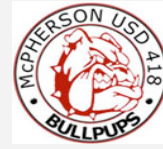

Class Computer Programming

Course Description:

This course provides an introduction to Visual Basic .NET. Topics include the Visual Basic .NET Integrated Development Environment, building an application in the Visual Basic .NET environment and working with variables, constants, data types, and expressions. Students also learn about decision making, looping and multiple forms, using menus, common dialogs, procedures, functions and arrays, debugging, creating executable files, and distributing a Windows application.

Materials needed for the class:

None - class fees pay for all consumable supplies.

Types of activities taking place in your classroom:

Lectures, short case studies, group exercises and discussions, examinations, and individual programming assignments will be used to develop proficiency in the Visual Basic .NET programming language.

How students will be evaluated:

Grades are determined by homework assignments, lab activities, quizzes and exams. Additionally, students receive 10 daily points based on the Four P's: Presence in class (attendance), Participation in class activities, Preparation for class, and how well the Please the instructor (behavior in class and adherence to rules and procedures of the class and school). The semester grade is calculated by dividing a student's point total by the total possible points.

Discipline rules and expectations:

1. Students will RESPECT
  - The teacher and the teacher's right to teach
  - The other students and their right to learn
  - The property of others, including school property
  - The rules and procedures established for the school and the classroom
  - Themselves, demonstrating appropriate behavior at all times
  
2. Students will be WHERE they are supposed to be, doing WHAT they are supposed to be doing, WHEN they are supposed to be doing it.

Consequences for inappropriate classroom behavior:

The consequences for inappropriate classroom behavior will normally progress in the following sequence, although exceptions may be in order depending on the nature of the misbehavior.

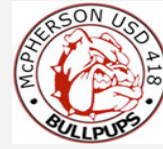
1. Verbal warning
2. Deduction of daily points or physical conditioning (student's choice)
3. Detention to be served no later than the afternoon of the following school day
4. Temporary restriction of computer access (for computer violations)
5. Conference with parents/legal guardians
6. Administrative referral
