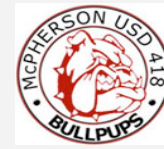

Discipline rules and expectations:

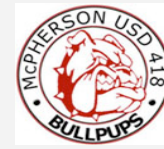
Deadlines:

2. No talking when I am teaching, or when another student is speaking / presenting.
3. No disrespectful language, inferences, or behavior towards others. Keep it clean.
4. Be in your assigned seat when the bell rings for staff meetings – not in the hallway or standing around the room. If you are not in your seat, you may be counted late.
5. Have all necessary materials with you at the start of class. You may be counted late if you have to go back to your locker during class.
6. Always ask to use the hall pass at appropriate times.
7. No cell phones are allowed to be out in class, following MHS policy.
8. You may use musical devices at times I deem appropriate – for example, during a work day. Obviously, never use them during instruction.
9. Keep it clean: This means the publications lab. Clean up the classroom before you leave. It also means the newsroom atmosphere. Speak respectfully about students and school faculty. If you can't say something respectful, then it probably shouldn't be said. Let's be honest and produce a great school newspaper, and let's do it in a way that everyone is proud to be associated with the High Life.

Consequences for inappropriate classroom behavior:

Consequences for Student Non-Compliance:

1. First instance = Verbal warning.
2. Second instance = 15 minute detention, before or after school. The time will be arranged at the teacher's convenience, not the student's.
3. Third instance = Office Referral (possibly resulting in ISS or OSS).
