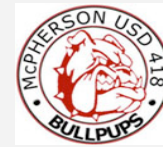

Class Team Activities

Period

Course Description:

This course is a physical education class open to juniors and seniors. This is a semester class offered to juniors and seniors and may be taken one time each year. The main focus is team activities such as: softball, volleyball, soccer, basketball, wiffleball, team handball, eclipse ball, speedball, touch football/brisketball, indoor hockey, and scooter games. Both skills and knowledge are emphasized.

Materials needed for the class:

Gym apparel, as outlined by the board of education: full white t-shirt without any obscene or suggestive slogans, RED shorts, athletic socks, and gym shoes necessary for gym activities.

Types of activities taking place in your classroom:

Each semester, the team activities will be broken down into two nine-week periods. During one nine-week period, the following would be offered: volleyball, basketball, wiffleball, team handball, and indoor hockey. During the other nine weeks there would be offered: softball, soccer, speedball, touch football/brisketball, and scooter games. The order of these activities could be altered due to facility usage. Written test may also be given on any of the activities.

How students will be evaluated:

Each semester, the team activities will be broken down into two nine-week periods. Discipline rules and expectations:

Respect the right of the teacher to teach and the student to learn. Students need to be on time to class. We feel the seniors should be able to make it to class on time. A tardy results in a 20-minute detention for each offense. 40 minutes will be expected if the student fails to make up the original tardy. An office referral would be the next step if the student still fails to take care of the tardy. Tardies are served at the teacher's discretion. Students are expected to take care of equipment they use. The locker room should be kept clean.

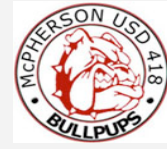
Consequences for inappropriate classroom behavior:
